The RRR Program covers Social and Emotional Learning across all levels of primary and secondary education: Emotional Literacy; Personal Strengths; Positive Coping; Problem Solving; Stress Management; Help Seeking; Gender and Identity; and Positive Gender Relationships.



### **Annual Implementation Plan 2024**

Each year school's identify some areas to focus on for the year. The Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) has been signed off by myself, the School Council President and the Department of Education and Training representatives at the end of 2023 in readiness for the year. During the two curriculum days at the start of the week, staff worked through elements of the AIP goals for the year. Our goals are:

- \* Further developing an evidence-based literacy approach.
- \* Strengthening the identification of anxiety in students, and embed staff capability to provide support.

Everyone across our school has a role to achieve these outcomes. It is a learning journey for many of us as we extend our knowledge about effective teaching and learning in Literacy and gain a greater understanding about anxiety, its levels and the required supports.

When I spoke with students this week, I talked about the need to be challenged and to embrace the brain's capacity to do this. I mentioned that making mistakes is a part of life and having a strong mindset and good support around help to work through these opportunities.

### **Building and Maintenance Works**

Over the holidays we have had a number of tradespeople finishing off the roofing works, which will be completed hopefully at the end of this week. Some minor painting and split system modifications will occur during the rest of the month.

You will also notice that a number of bushes and shrubs have been pruned to present our school in a lovely condition to our students. As always students and families are able to play and enjoy our facilities before and after school and on the weekends.

### **Newsletter and Facebook updates**

Our newsletter has traditionally come out fortnightly, from now on, the newsletter will alternate with a Facebook video update. This will allow people to access important information on phones and devices. We look forward to showcasing our school more via this approach.

### **Bell Times**

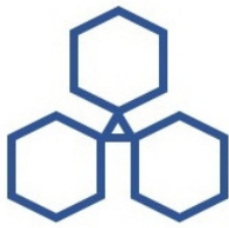

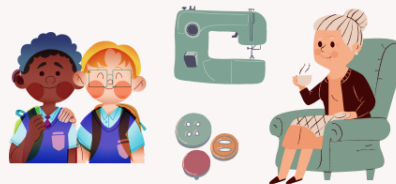
