Acting Principal's Report

Building Works

I am pleased to report that the final stage of the staffroom and student toilets will be completed over the weekend. This has gone well over time and I have been working with the building contractors (via the education department) to have this finished. There will some further works in the nearby space outside the staffroom later in the year.



A Compass notification was sent out this week regarding the staged

roofing works that will start next week and finish just before the end of the school year. There will be students, staff and resources in temporary spaces for allotments of time, roughly 5-6 weeks per building. Your classroom teachers will inform you of which classrooms will be moving and where to.

On Thursday I met with members of the Victorian School Building Authority about the planning stage for comprehensive building works to improve the facilities so that they are upgraded to the teaching and learning needs of our students now and into the future.

Continuing on this theme the principal office has had a complete overhaul, bringing the space into an environment conducive to principal based work and discussions. The office staff have been wonderful in putting up with the paint smell and some of the banging noises to improve this space to an orderly working space. My wife and kids will enjoy a weekend off from assisting this week.

NAPLAN results

Our recent NAPLAN results demonstrate the fantastic teaching and learning that occurs across our whole school. This year NAPLAN was held in early Term 1, with the results released two weeks ago. As a staff, we looked at the successes at a staff meeting and celebrated the work and dedication of staff and students to achieve these outstanding results.

Eastbourne PS was ahead of similar schools (schools that are determined by the NAPLAN statisticians) in 9 out of 10 areas. This is a terrific achievement.
