InitiaLit —Jodie Hornsby, Assistant Principal

Eastbourne and Rosebud Secondary College have been working together to improve literacy outcomes for our students. This has involved some Professional Learning about the Science of Learning. We have been discussing latest brain research and how humans learn.

This was followed up with some more collaboration when the Literacy Specialist from Rosebud secondary delivered some learning for our Gr 3-6 staff about the explicit teaching of reading and analysing more complex text. She has also been working here onsite with some identified students from Year 6 to prepare them for Secondary School.

In F-2, staff have been learning about the Science of Reading and implementing a new program called InitiaLit. We are very fortunate to be financially supported by the Mornington Peninsula Foundation to acquire this new program and resources. Our students have the best possible chance to have success in reading.
